# PARKING AND TRANSPORTATION

Fringe continues to be committed to promote primarily the use of alternate forms of transportation to access the site, and promote only the use of paid public parking for drivers.

This year, we will continue using signs in the area immediately adjacent to the King Edward Elementary, Academy at King Edward, and the Strathcona Community League. The signs will be as depicted below:

Our main site is one block north of Whyte Avenue, and is very close to residential neighbourhoods. It is important that all Fringe staff, volunteers, and festival goers respect our neighbours. Please obey street signs and traffic laws, park appropriately, keep the grounds litter free, and be mindful of noise after 11:00pm.

#### Pogo CarShare

If driving is your best option, consider using <u>Pogo CarShare services</u>. With 24/7 access to cars located all across Edmonton, pogo-ing is a simple solution to fringing. #### Festival Shuttle Service

If you are travelling between the main Festival site in Old Strathcona and <u>The French Quarter</u> venues, catch the FREE Fringe Shuttle sponsored by the Old Strathcona Businesses and The French Quarter.

August 16-26, 2018 from 12Noon to 12Midnight

- Leaves the east side of Gateway Boulevard and Corner of 83 Avenue on the hour (:00) and half hour (:30)
- Leaves the south side of 86 Avenue and corner of 101 Street at five after (:05) and 35 after (:35)
- Leaves the north side of 86 Avenue and corner of 91 Street at quarter after (:15) and quarter to (:45)
- Leaves the north side of 82 Avenue and corner of 96 Street starting at 6pm through 12Midnight at 20 after (:20) and ten-to (:50)

Please give yourself enough time to get to Fringe events, as the shuttle can't guarantee exact times.

#### **Edmonton Transit Service**

Bus Routes 4, 7, 52, 57, 94, and 327 stop along Whyte Avenue close to the ATB Financial Arts Barns and the Festival site.

### Walking

Most venues are within walking distance of each other. During peak traffic times the sidewalks to and from venues are busy, so please give yourself plenty of time to make your way through the Festival.

#### Cycling

Thanks to our partners at the <u>Edmonton Bicycle Commuters Society</u>, there are two bicycle parking lots available:

- 1. South of 85 Avenue on 104 Street (by Knox Evangelical Free Church)
- 2. 104 Street / 84 Avenue (the Edmonton Public Library's Strathcona Branch)

Please be advised that these lots are not always monitored and cyclists leave their bicycles at their own risk.

The City of Edmonton also provides public bike racks in front of <u>Next Act Pub</u> (8224 104 St NW) and near Starbucks (10370 82 Ave NW).

For safety purposes we ask that you please refrain from cycling through the grounds during Festival.

# **High Level Streetcar**

The <u>Streetcar</u> is the perfect mode of transportation when traveling to and from north of the river. And, the Edmonton Radial Railway Society increases the frequency of its trips to Old Strathcona during the Festival. You can view the schedule here.


#### **Parking**

Year-round metered parking and lots are readily available throughout Old Strathcona. These are the three closest paid parking lots:

- East of the ATB Financial Arts Barns [in the Old Strathcona Farmers' Market parking lot]
- West of the Fringe sit on 83 Avenue and 104 Street

During Festival parking in our immediate area becomes much more limited, so we encourage you to use public and alternate transportation. If you do need to drive, please help us be good neighbours and resist the urge to park along the residential side streets – it's the closest thing to a driveway a city-dweller has.

#### **WASTE SERVICES**

The Fringe works with the City of Edmonton, a private contractor, local businesses and adjacent residents along with a number of staff, volunteers, and contracted groups to manage waste services, and work in an effort to reduce the impact of increased activity. Contract services are limited to the Festival Site proper, but crews do respond to extraordinary needs as the festival progresses.

# **Strathcona Eco Station**

The City of Edmonton is responsible for the temporary relocation of the recycling bins on the south side of 85 Ave, east of 104 Street.
