Anxiety can make children and teens think that bad things will happen to them and that normal life situations will be much worse than they are. But if they can understand their anxious thoughts and feelings, and develop the right coping skills, they can move towards more independence and eventually become happy and secure adults. In this workshop, we will discuss the role of anxiety and how it impacts

brain development. We will also discuss how to recognize anxiety in young children and offer strategies that parents, and caregivers can use to help their children stay regulated.
