SET UP

Parkland:

- As of Saturday, August 6 at 0700 hrs:
 - o Dr. Wilbert MacIntyre Park; and
 - Lighthorse Park

Roadways:

- As of Monday, July 4 at 0700 hrs:
 - CP Rail Lands use as staging grounds for Event set up
- As of Friday, August 5 at 0700 hrs
 - o Full closure of 104 Street Service Lane from 82 to 86 Avenue

- Full closure of 83 Avenue from Calgary Trail to Gateway Boulevard including the bike lane
- Full closure of 84 Avenue from Calgary Trail to Arts Barns including Service Alley between 84 & 83 Avenue
- Full closure of 83 Avenue parking lots including the lot north of El Cortez (lot 5066) and the lot east of the Westbury Theatre (parkland)
- The alley between 82 & 83 Avenue and 104 and 103 Street to remain open to east/west vehicle traffic given business servicing and parking access.
- A pedestrian access point to be maintained between the Fringe licensed area and the alley leading to the back alley businesses (Sugared & Spiced Bakery)
- *NEW this year* Full closure of 85 Avenue from Calgary Trail to alley will leave access for businesses
- As of Monday, August 8 at 0500 hrs:
 - Travel lane closure on the west side of 103 Street from 82 to 85 Avenue including the parking lane from 83 to 84 Avenue (set by Traffic Operations)
 - Street sign fixture removal on 83 Street from Calgary Trail to Gateway Boulevard and 84
 Avenue from 104 St to alley (by Traffic Operations). Map to follow.
 - Full closure of the alley between 103 & 104 Street north of 85 Avenue to the Light Horse Park entrance/youth shelter fence line including the Light Horse Park southeast corner parking stalls. (set by Traffic Operations)
 - Closure of parking stalls along the west side of the 104 Street service lane (next to active traffic) between 82 to 83 Avenue
- As of Wednesday, August 10 at 0800 hrs:
 - The following areas are to be defined as loading zones for the operations of the OSBA. Some locations to be shared use with ETS/DATS/Free Fringe Shuttle. NOTE: the west lane of 103 Street between 83 Avenue and 85 Avenue will be closed during the Event.
 - Northbound east parking lane on Gateway Blvd north of 82 Avenue. EPark Zone 5013a.

Getting to Fringe

ALTERNATE TRANSPORTATION

In partnership with Bike Edmonton, Edmonton Transit Service, and the Edmonton Radial Railway Society, Fringe enthusiastically encourages Fringers to find neighbourhood-friendly ways to get to and from the site, including:

- Biking: bike parking lots are available on site, but be sure to bring your own lock!
- **Edmonton Transit Service:** Edmonton Transit in our transportation of choice for getting to Fringe! Routes 8, 701, 4, 404, 523, or 9 along Whyte Avenue or Gateway Boulevard will get fringers close to site.
- High Level Street Car: the historic High Level Street Car runs daily during the Festival from 11am
 9:30pm Sunday through Friday and 9am
 9:30pm on Saturdays.
- Free Fringe Shuttle: the Fringe Shuttle returns this year! This free service takes fringers from the main site to the French Quarter and back again. The Shuttle departs on the hour and half hour and will run daily during the following hours:

NEIGHBOURHOOD SIGNAGE

NEIGHBOURHOOD RENEWAL

The Strathcona Neighbourhood Renewal construction schedule has adjusted timing to work together with festivals to ensure festivals have the appropriate space and public access.

WASTE SERVICES

In collaboration with the City of Edmonton, contractors, local businesses, adjacent residents, and our own staff and volunteer team, Fringe makes every possible effort to reduce the impact of increased activity in the neighbourhood. Contract services are limited to the Festival site proper, but crews do respond to extraordinary needs as the Festival progresses.

STRATHCONA RECYCLING DEPOT

The City of Edmonton is responsible for the temporary relocation of the recycling bins on the south side of 85 Avenue, east of 104 Street.

COMMUNITY CONSULTATION

Edmonton Fringe will continue to meet with the Strathcona Community League and the City of Edmonton Civic Events Office to discuss future planning and debrief following this year's Festival.
