- 6.1. <u>Treasurer</u> John de Haan
 - 6.1.1. Still in the blue ahead of the budget. We're roughly \$21k ahead of budget. Expect to end the year at around this amount.

6.1.3. SCCL Proposed Budget 2023-2024

- 6.1.3.1. Projecting a surplus for 2023-2024 of \$19540
- 6.1.3.2. This helps us to break even over the past four years
- 6.1.3.3. Question: What about casino money? What can it be spent on? Answer: It can generally be spent on building maintenance. If there is money left over a special request can be made to AGLC to spend it.
- 6.1.3.4. Maureen noted that the reason that we have a surplus is because of John being an excellent treasurer and because we have Scott to run the hall. Other community league are closing because they are running on only volunteers.
- 6.1.3.5. John highlighted that there is >\$30k in program income. Thanks to Donna!
- 6.1.3.6. Donna brought up that the EFCL negotiated a group discount to be able to show movies in the hall.
 - We used to have to pay \$350 per film for a license.
 - We can pay \$350 for the year to show any number of films at multiple events through the year.
 - The films must be selected through a distributor.
 - Some of the movies are newly released to theatres!

- 6.2. <u>Programs</u> Donna Fong
 - 6.2.1. Spring programs end this month and resume in September
 - 6.2.2. Playgroup wants to continue over the summer, but unfortunately the hall is booked by Adaptabilities
 - 6.2.3. Summertime art classes will be offered end of July
 - 6.2.4. Green Shack
 - 6.2.4.1. Free drop in Monday-Fridays 2:30-5:30pm
 - 6.2.4.2. A kick-off party
 - Sally asked that Donna contact her about the kickoff party so that she can put the info on social media
 - 6.2.4.3. Donations are not needed from the Community League
 - 6.2.5. Community League swim doesn't happen outdoors some people have been asking
 - 6.2.6. August 4th is the deadline for the August 22nd newsletter
- 6.3. <u>Civics & Planning</u> Maureen Duguay Emily Graca
 - 6.3.1. 104th street development program has been paused
 - 6.3.1.1. The city needs to wait to see how this work fits into other projects
 - 6.3.2. Reached out to Boyle Street
 - 6.3.2.1. They have received a development permit, but this has been appealed.
 - 6.3.2.2. The appeal hearing is taking place June 27th and 28th
 - 6.3.2.3. After the appeals, the SDAB will make a decision if they can move forward with the Class A Development Permit.
 - 6.3.3. 8305 99 St (formely DV8 pub)
 - 6.3.3.1. Change to RA8 zoning (from DC2 with commercial space) has been accepted.
 - 6.3.3.2. Michael Janz did not support the league wanting to more commercial space because there is a glut of commercial space in the city right now
 - 6.3.3.3. Question: is commercial space optional? Yes, it's optional, but no commercial is needed.
 - 6.3.3.4. Farhana did a nice job of presenting on her behalf.
 - 6.3.4. Got some renderings for the old Catholic Social Services site
 - 6.3.4.1. Beljan has asked for the community league to support their new development permit
 - 6.3.4.2. They want to put in restaurant space Gord noted that a community member would own the restaurant
 - 6.3.4.3. Maureen asked for the plans
 - 6.3.5. Scona District Council has gone through the 800 page document about new zoning bylaws Maureen and the council have gone through the RS and RM zone
 - 6.3.5.1. Update on Proposed New Zoning Bylaw.docx Google Docs
 - 6.3.5.2. Green space will be reduced because of less setbacks
 - 6.3.5.3. Communications will send out information to the

community to highlight that there are changes coming

- 6.3.5.4. The hope was that zoning would change so that there wouldn't need to be so may variances
- 6.3.6. Would like the SCCL to provide feedback on the Guiding Principles for the Old Strathcona Public Realm
 - 6.3.6.1. We will revisit this in the fall.
 - 6.3.6.2. Would like the Guiding Principles to focus on how we interact with our community (e.g. the market, the festivals)
- 6.3.7. Jason looked into the environmental assessments for the Bateman property and Todd Cleaners.
 - 6.3.7.1. There are lots of contaminants in the soil in that area.
 - 6.3.7.2. <u>Environment and Protected Areas Environmental Site</u> <u>Assessment Repository (alberta.ca)</u>
 - 6.3.7.3. Development is not likely in the short term.
 - 6.3.7.4. Maureen will ask about the Catholic Social Services development and whether this contamination impacts this.
- 6.4. <u>Garden</u> Jacquie Devlin
 - 6.4.1. There has been some conversation about adding a second garden site. This is an early stage.
 - 6.4.2. We could potentially add a garden against the fence where there is an "alley" (it's supposed to be a dead-end)
 - 6.4.3. Lindsay: This a lengthy proposal kind of like the hall & grounds renewal

 - 6.13.2. Animal Control will be doing some patrolling of Mill Creek and the meadow but this will be during the day (and most people let their dogs run during the evenings and weekends)
 - 6.13.3. Seemed to be a need for an online safety kids training (brought up a de-escalation training)
 - 6.13.4. Community member is concerned with a smell in the area near Tubby Bateman
 - 6.13.4.1. There are a few locations in the neighbourhood which smell occasionally
 - 6.13.4.2. Epcor is really good a dodging these complaints
 - 6.13.4.3. Maureen advises that the community league hasn't had any luck with dealing with Epcor
 - 6.13.5. Looking at a safety plan for the events held at the hall
 - 6.13.5.1. Exec thought that a safety plan template should be available
 - 6.13.5.2. Should we get a defibrillator and a choking device? Gord will put together a list of items that we should have in the hall
 - 6.13.6. OSACC meeting June 13th at 8:30am in the hall
